#### Historic Fayetteville Elementary School Redevelopment Project Narrative

#### **Project Summary**

The West Virginia University Research Corporation (WVURC) seeks West Virginia Water Development Authority (WV WDA) Economic Enhancement Grant Funding for a leasehold improvement with 95% Properties LLC who are a part of redeveloping the historic Fayetteville schools - former high school, middle school, and elementary school - for mixed-use development. Specifically, the grant will be for a long-term leasehold improvement agreement to redevelop the former elementary school gym into a coworking space for the Ascend WV program. This project will be completed in conjunction with the inprogress historic redevelopment project that includes a current investment of \$15.25 million to convert the historic schools into a boutique hotel, townhomes, apartments, and to restore one of the town's most historic structures, Italian heritage walls, which makes up part of the streetscape.

If funded, 95% Properties LLC will partner with the WVURC to build out a coworking space and programming hub for the Ascend WV remote worker relocation program. The Ascend WV program welcomes remote workers to move to West Virginia, thereby attracting talented individuals dedicated to building community, finding purpose, and exploring the outdoors, while providing economic impacts that benefit the communities to which they move. To date, Ascend WV has received over 28,000 applications, a number that is constantly growing at an unprecedented pace. Through an in-depth selection process, individuals are chosen to join cohorts in each of Ascend WV's featured communities. The average individual salary of Ascend WV's members is \$117,635 and on average, each member represents a household of 1.9 new residents. In each location, Ascend WV members participate in a two-year program, including socials, trips, an outdoor recreation package, gear rentals, coworking space membership, professional development, and other incentives and experiences designed to promote community and encourage retention. Through the program's first two years, the retention rate for Ascend WV has remained at 98%.

The addition of a coworking space near downtown Fayetteville where remote workers can network with other professionals, socialize, shop downtown, and launch their outdoor recreation activities will significantly enhance the program's effectiveness in local economic impact. According to WVU's Bureau of Business and Economic Research, the Ascend WV program in the New River Gorge area will create \$100.5 million in economic impact with an added 302 jobs created through direct spending. The total cumulative economic impact of the 1,000 remote workers under the 50 percent retention rate scenario results in a tremendous \$365.5 million in economic output which in turn creates an added 1,100 new jobs beyond those relocating through the program. Based on the first two years of data, Ascend WV believes these numbers are just a part of the total economic impact to be realized.

Creating valuable infrastructure to support coworking will help West Virginia and the New River Gorge region to continue to attract the growing remote workforce. 92 million Americans already have the option to work remotely for at least a portion of the week, and this number is expected to grow rapidly, according to the American Opportunity Survey from <a href="Mckinsey and Company">Mckinsey and Company</a>. With recent work by Governor Justice and the West Virginia Legislature, West Virginia is perfectly positioned to continue growing in this area.

#### **Building Summary**

The Fayetteville Elementary School was closed approximately 20 years ago and was used for storage space for some time after. In December 2011, the Fayette County Board of Education deeded the old school to the Town of Fayetteville. While the property was being maintained by the Town, efforts for large-scale redevelopment were reignited in 2022 when Governor Jim Justice announced a \$15+ million tourism and redevelopment project, by Fayetteville native Charles Wendell, slated for the historic schoolhouses. Under this larger project, Mr. Wendell will convert the former high school and the adjacent middle school building into a 45-50 room boutique hotel. The neighboring elementary school building will be transformed into 20 apartment units with four added townhomes nearby.

While the elementary school gymnasium was not a large part of the initial project, it holds great promise as a coworking space for the Ascend WV remote worker program. This project will include the transformation of roughly 5,000 square feet into conference room space, breakout rooms, open coworking stations, soft seating areas, private phone booths for online meetings, and storage area. This space will serve an estimated 105 remote workers in the first 4 years of operation in the New River Gorge area as part of the Ascend WV program.

#### **Financial Summary**

With \$15.25 million in private redevelopment already underway in this downtown block, the coworking space improvements would bring the total up to \$16.75 million. Considering the overall project, the coworking space is met by nearly a 90% private match.

The project is also secured by a direct match from Ascend WV with an expected spend of \$3.79 million in the Fayetteville area. The WVURC, through the Brad and Alys Smith Outdoor Economic Development Collaborative, will supply \$2,689,173 in match through participant stipends, program operational expenses, participant programming costs, and human resource costs. If the full grant is awarded, WVURC will supply 60% in total direct match to the project.

The Ascend WV component of the project is \$3.79 million, with the \$1.5 million requested for this grant, will enable a full revitalization of the gymnasium for the purposes of economic and community development and the complete redevelopment of all three schools. As a result, 95% Properties LLC will manage all aspects of design and construction, market, lease, maintain, and manage the property for a period of 15 years to the Ascend WV program at \$1 per year. In the unlikely event that WVU Research Corporation discontinues use of the space, the lease would transfer to the Town of Fayetteville for communal use.

The West Virginia University Research Corporation requests \$1,500,000 in support of this project.

#### Request

The West Virginia University Research Corporation, alongside 95% Properties LLC, request funding in the amount of \$1,500,000 to support:

- \$1,200,000 will support the execution of a leasehold improvement agreement to fully redevelop the gymnasium to modern turnkey functionality for a \$1 a year rent for 15 years to house Ascend WV's 5,000 square feet coworking space.
- \$300,000 will support associated facility costs.

#### To whom it may concern:

The Clay County Commission is requesting funding for its completion of our judicial annex. This will house the Sheriff's office, holding cells, Magistrate's offices, and court room. These offices are currently located in the Old Courthouse, which is not handicapped accessible and in need of upgrades. Once the offices are moved into the annex, the Commission plans to donate the Old Courthouse to the Historical Society. In which they have plans to turn it into a historical museum for Clay County tourism.

In 2014 the major employer and only mining interest in Clay County ceased operation and reduced the revenue of the county commission by approximately \$500,000.00 annually, leaving the building unfinished. In 2016 the flood ravaged the building and all interior walls up to 4ft. FEMA would not cover the cost of these damages because the infrastructure was not completed.

In May of 2022 the County Commission did pay to have a floor plan drawing completed, that has now been approved by the supreme court. The Commission has advertised for architects and has received 8 letters of interest but has not interviewed or made final selection. If funded the Commission would move forward immediately to select an architect. Once plans are completed the project would be placed out for bid, and construction could start immediately. We are hoping to have this project completed by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. The Commission is requesting \$1,450,000.00 to complete the design, construction, and equip the judicial annex. If funded the County Commission has set aside \$150,000.00 as in-kind matching to help complete the project.



#### **SCOPE of Work:**

The purpose of this grant is to upgrade the current facility by adding an additional steel building 125' X 140' which will provide two additional multipurpose courts to the existing three, increase the size of the fitness center and to construct concession stands with seating areas. Also, four baseball/softball fields and additional parking spaces continue to be evaluated. Note: Placement of ball fields within the confines of Chief Logan Park or adjacent DNR Public Lands is preferred. Portable items such as stages, sound, lights will be purchased to be used at both the Conference and Recreation Centers. Additional details can be seen in the budget.




